GARY P.BELL — is the recently retired Nature Conservancy of Canada's Program Manager for Eastern Ontario. Gary received his BSc from Queen's and his MSc and PhD from Carleton University. His current work is focused on the A2A Region where he has completed conservation planning for the Frontenac Arch and has negotiated the purchase of over 4,000 acres of priority conservation lands.
