Role Description

- Develop partnerships with local trail organizations, First Nations, communities, and businesses
- Facilitate conversations with partners to define the concept of the trail, trail location, design criteria, and a stewardship plan
- Collect and integrate partner feedback on the project and process after each meeting
- Liaise with GIS technician to map existing and potential new trails
- Communicate the project well, online, in print, and in person
- Report on progress to the Board of Directors and funders

- Ability to interpret spatial data and understand maps
